Old Town Hall

Former town hall, the oldest secular building in Brno. The visits to the Gothic portal, courtyard and vaulted passage with respected symbols of the city – the crocodile and the wheel, are free of charge. The tower is accessible April to December, the ticket covers also entry to the Fresco Hall, Crystal Hall and Treasury. The tour is individual, without guide.

Cellar under the New Town Hall

This cellar, built for the royal mintmasters not long after Brno was founded, has been brought to life with a new cutting-edge exhibition devoted to the city's legends. In a series of animated stories you'll meet Lord Šembera or discover more about the Brno dragon and the wheel. See what a medieval market looked like and experience firsthand life during Brno's siege by the Swedes.

After heading back onto the street, you can learn about more legends thanks to the first-person narratives on the website.

The royal castle dating from the 13th century, later used as a fortress and prison, really noticeable dominant of Brno. Today owned by the Brno City Museum. The fortifications, courtyards and casemates of the castle are open to the public every day throughout the year. In the second bigger courtyard you can see the castle well and above it the carillon, playing every top of the hour one of 32 tunes. The southwestern bastion and lookout tower are accessible throughout the high season, April to September, also on Monday (lookout tower weather permitting). The exhibits and installations of Brno City Museum are closed on Monday.

Jewish Cemetery

Today still functional cemetery, established in 1852, with some 12 thousand graves the largest Jewish cemetery in Moravia. Graves of many important people from the areas of politics, culture, religion or science.

Stiassni Villa

Art Nouveau villa, built in 1903–04, was owned in 1913–39 by Jewish textile magnate Alfred Löw-Beer. In 1929 he gave upper part of the garden to his daughter Greta as a wedding gift – for construction of her and her husband's Fritz Tugendhat dream modern house, famous villa Tugendhat, built in 1929–30 according to the design by Ludwig Miese van der Rohe. Both villas are visible from the garden, Villa Löw-Beer as well as the gallery and café Celnice are closed on Monday.

A magnificent functionalist villa with a three-hectare garden. Designed by the architect Ernst Wiesner for the family of Alfred Stiassni, a Jewish textile manufacturer, this villa ranks among the most significant residential buildings built in the interwar period.

Following extensive renovations, it was reopened to the public in 2014.

St. Peter and Paul's Cathedral



St. James' Church

The one-nave church, one of the most important dominants of Brno, has history stretching into 70's of 12th century. You can visit the cathedral interior, the treasury and the church tower every day of the week. It is possible also to see a crypt – with a local guide you will find inside the cathedral.

Late Gothic three-nave church, established in the beginning of the 13th century, stands in Jakubské náměstí square. The beautiful interior is dominated by high altar, and behind it you will find the memorial of field marshal Jean Louis Raduit de Souches – the commander-in-chief of Brno defence during the Swedish siege in 1645. The church is currently being renovated, after which the new tours and tower will be open.

Baroque Minorite complex was built in 1722–33, by rebuilding of the Church of St. John the Baptist from 13th century and newer Church of St. John the Evangelist – according to the design by Moritz Grimm. In 18th century the Loreto Chapel was added, copying the chapel in Loreto, Italy. The Holy Stairs, copy of the stairs in Jerusalem trod by Jesus on his way to Pilatus, are very impressive.

Church of the Holy Cross with Capuchin Crypt

The crypt is located under the Church of the Holy Cross (kostel Nalezení svatého kříže). Inside you can see mummified bodies of members of the Capuchin Order and its benefactors, well preserved thanks to very sofisticated system of air ventilation, and also original painted Baroque coffins. One of them belongs to the adventurer, high officer and later a prisoner at the Špilberk Castle – Baron Franz von Trenck.

Diocesan Museum

The Diocesan Museum was established in 1993 as a very first museum of its kind in the Czech Republic. Besides the permanent exhibit Vita Christi (Life of Jesus Christ) there are thematic exhibitions held in the crypt of St. Peter and Paul's Cathedral (June to September).

Brno City Museum -Reservoirs

Brno City Museum on Špilberk Castle invites you to its unique underground spaces: the repaired water reservoirs, which originally supplied the city of Brno with water (and now houses a lapidary), and the bastion – an impressive example of fortress construction in earlier times. In the former underground reservoirs on Špilberk, which once supplied the city's water, a new "temple" has opened for you to behold stone witnesses to Brno's history.

Botanical Garden of the Faculty of Science of Masaryk University in Brno



Botanical Garden and Arboretum of Mendel University in Brno

Botanical garden was founded in 1922 – for the students and the public alike. Outside exhibits are accessible throughout the year, free of charge. You can also visit four greenhouses with tropical and subtropical plants here.

Botanical garden was founded in 1938 for educational purpose of Mendel University. The area of the garden is 11 hectars in total and you will find 4000 species of orchids, 300 species of tillandsias, 2000 species of perennial plants, 350 species of irises, 500 species of rock plants and 4000 species of woody plants here.

Brno Zoo, established in 1953, offers on hillsides of Mniši hora (Monks' Hill) in Brno-Bystrc the views on many animals from all over the world, among others tigers, lions and polar bears.

Brno Observatory and Planetarium

This institution is focused on popularization of various sciences, especially astronomy. The outside observational terrace is accessible during the day – you can enjoy nearly "magical" view on the city of Brno from here. You can also try several interactive displays in front of the observatory building: e.g. kaleidoscope, pixel wall, auditory canal, planetary dynamometer or spectroscope. Monday mornings are usually reserved for school groups, afternoon and evening programmes are for the public.

Amusement science park with permanent interactive exhibits for the children and adults alike. In the Science Theatre you can watch regular performances with many entertaining experiments.

The Open Gardens are an ideal place in the heart of Brno for relaxation, education, and fun. At our center, you'll find the Four


Elements teaching garden and the former Boromej Gardens, where you'll experience the agricultural cycle from soil to fork.
